RECTOR'S RAMBLE



When you read Sherlock Holmes stories you know what you are getting: a mystery that flummoxes Lestrade, and Sherlock being brilliant. Read enough and, while the detection continues to delight, the relationship between Holmes and Watson becomes as important — because we love them.

For me *Astrid: Murder in Paris* (on Channel 4) has this same quality. We are drawn in by the detective work, we stay for the characters. Here Sherlock is replaced by Astrid Nielsen, a police archivist, and Watson by Raphaëlle Coste, a detective. The twist that distinguishes this from hundreds of others is that Astrid is autistic, and the reason more of us don't know about it is that it is in French with English subtitles — so no doom scrolling on your phone at the same time!

Astrid may be 'only' an archivist, but she has two great strengths — a phenomenal memory of every crime she has archived, and a compulsive need to solve puzzles. She has incredible strengths and incredible weaknesses — her need for order and calm is ill-suited to the chaos of crime investigation. But this is Raphaëlle's strength: she is warm-hearted, street-smart, good with people. Astrid's unsought but invaluable help in the pilot extends, episode by episode, into a partnership in which they capitalise on each other's strengths, first in solving murders, and then in doing life.

And this is the real joy of *Astrid*. We are drawn brilliantly into Astrid's life and mindset. She isn't just a gimmick, this is a programme with an agenda — to help us understand the world of autistic people, and how strange they find our world. Astrid has an autism support group in which they discuss how weird neurotypicals are (often to comic effect), while a host of support characters find themselves frustrated by, baffled by, and then respecting Astrid: Fournier the medical examiner; Nico, Raphaëlle's colleague; William Thomas the support group leader, and more.

Central to this is character growth — so often feared in long-running series. Astrid and Raphaëlle grow in friendship and trust, and Astrid learns to break through the barriers of her carefully curated world into a richer life. But it's a two-way street: Raphaëlle's new best friend enriches her own life incalculably too.

When we meet people who are 'difficult' or 'different' we can easily blame them for 'not trying to fit in'. *Astrid* lets us in on a world in which some people can't 'just fit in' — but are absolutely no less deserving of our love and admiration.

PART 1: INTRODUCTION TO HEALTH-CARE ETHICS

All of us are affected by healthcare: through our own experience with GPs or hospitals and that of our family, and of course we're paying for the NHS in our taxes. I have invited David Burgess, a retired nurse and lecturer in health-care ethics to partner with me in discussion of medical ethics over the next few months.

TIM:

At the risk of being simplistic: isn't ethics within healthcare quite straightforward? You are required to heal and not to harm, right?

DAVE:

On day one of each term in the nursing training programme at the University of Suffolk, I would introduce the subject of professional values, starting with the Nursing and Midwifery Council Code which says that nurses should provide care that is safe and effective. Sounds simple; sounds clear. However, most effective care has risks and most safe care produces poor results. We shouldn't be surprised: risk nothing - gain nothing. Even in the prescribing of medication you can see this, e.g. the most effective antidepressant is the most dangerous, and the safest antidepressant is amongst the lowest in performance.

Later, I would present the student nurses with a thought experiment: an end-of-life scenario in which a couple have promised each other that they will be together when one of them dies. When the day comes, the wife cannot be there and misses her husband's passing by ten minutes. The nurses must decide whether they will tell her the truth (meaning she has 'broken' her promise and causing her great despair and emotional pain), or whether they say that the husband is unconscious and about to die and she can say goodbye — thus keeping her promise and preventing the distress of such a breach? The aim was to put the student nurses in touch with their deepest values, and, more importantly, to find out which values override others. Some thought that telling the truth was paramount; others favoured reducing distress and suffering; some were swayed by the fear of consequences to their reputation or to patient trust.

TIM:

We all value truthfulness, but sometimes being a 'true' friend is more than telling the truth! Your exercise shows that ethical thought is a group practice, and there is no clear answer. I look forward to talking with you in future months about pain, dying well, medical risk, and cost-effectiveness in healthcare. Thank you!

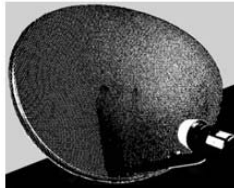

May is the month for resolution voting. There were two resolutions for debate and both were supported by members.



Resolution 1: Accessible Public Toilet Facilities to Promote Dignity, Health and Social Inclusion

This resolution is a call for accessible, clean, free public toilets which are fundamental to inclusion and wellbeing for women, older people, disabled individuals, parents and carers. Vote: Majority in favour.

Resolution 2: Action on Women's Homelessness

The NFWI echoes the calls of homelessness charities and urges all levels of government to take action to reduce women's homelessness, reduce the number of women at risk of homelessness, and improve the quality of temporary accommodation. Vote: All in favour.

After this we were treated to a very skilful clay session. Billie Bond, sculptor and Westleton WI member, described the 'slab built' technique for making mugs from clay, with a live demonstration of how to make two styles – an 'ear mug' and a 'D mug' – named for the shape of their handles.

Billie also shared the family connection she has with some of the tools she uses to decorate her mugs, using the 'intaglio' method of impressing the clay, which members enjoyed and admired. We all wished Billie well with the finalisation of her commission of a sculpture of Elizabeth Andrews, OBE, JP, now celebrated for campaigning for the health of miners and their families in Wales. *Gill Wood*

WESTLETON PARISH COUNCIL – JUNE/JULY 2026

When I last wrote, I was preparing for **Westleton's Annual Parish Meeting** on 18th May. It was a successful and well-attended evening, with fifty-nine attendees and representatives from twenty-one organisations, groups, and businesses from across the parish. It was truly inspiring to see such a level of dedication and diversity of interests in a small village. Thank you to everyone who took the time to get involved, and to both Adnams and The Westleton Crown for their generous donations of refreshments.

Following the **County Council election** on 7th May, Westleton now has a new County Councillor in the shape of Westleton-resident John Matthews. The Parish Council wishes him well in his new role and looks forward to seeing him at its monthly meetings.

At the **Community Field**, the council will shortly receive a set of NFC tags that

will enable donations to be made using a mobile phone. It is hoped that this will boost donations at what is the council's largest asset in terms of costs. In light of this, I am always on the lookout for ways to achieve the best value for money for the council, and in turn taxpayers, and have recently secured a new three-year undertaking with a new insurer that will reduce the council's insurance premiums by around 18% per year.

The council has also decided to hold **monthly surgeries** for the remainder of 2026. These will take place on Mondays in the Village Hall from **10:30 to 11:30am** on the dates below, and provide residents with an opportunity to raise any questions, issues or concerns they may have between meetings: 13th July, 17th August, 14th September, 12th October, 16th November, 14th December.

Finally, the **Westleton Village Survey** is open until **31st August**. There has been a good number of responses so far, but we would still invite everyone who lives in and visits Westleton to get involved. There are forty questions covering a wide range of topics, and it takes around fifteen minutes to complete. Paper copies are available to pick up from and drop off at the Village Hall, the Post Office, the Crown pub, and the Church, but the easiest way to complete the survey is online at

ALDE VALLEY SUFFOLK FAMILY HISTORY GROUP

“Presenting and preserving the past” - Janet Few

Monday 20th July 2.30pm in Saxmundham

In a change to our previously advertised programme, the July meeting of the Alde Valley Suffolk Family History Group will be a talk by Janet Few entitled “Presenting and preserving the past”.

As family historians, we are the current custodians of family memory. With each generation that passes, some of that information leaches away. We owe it to those who follow to halt that erosion and preserve as much as possible of our family heritage. Family anecdotes and memories, photographs and our own reminiscences are part of that legacy, as well as the stories behind heirlooms and artefacts of family significance. These may not be items of monetary worth but their value in our shared past can be incalculable. This talk does not focus on scientific preservation and conservation techniques but on the importance of being a custodian of memory, with a duty to hand that down, giving suggestions as to how that might be achieved.

Dr. Janet Few is a British historian, genealogist, and author specialising in 17th-century social history. Best known for her educational books, living history interpretations as “Mistress Agnes,” and award-winning historical fiction, she is the president of the Family History Federation.

The talk takes place on Monday 20th July at 2.30pm, in person at the Fromus Centre, Street Farm Road, Saxmundham, IP17 1AL (behind the Library) and, for members only, on Zoom. The speaker will be talking to us on Zoom. The talk starts at 2.30pm. No need to book – just turn up — free for members and £5.00 for visitors, including tea/coffee/biscuits. Good, free car-parking. 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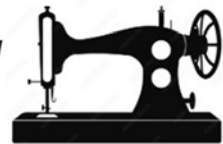
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PROJECT UPDATE

JULY 2026

As we enter the summer, we are finalising work to complete the construction phase of Yoxford and Friday Street roundabouts at the end of July.

Traffic cones and compounds will be removed at Yoxford, and the roundabout will be handed over to Suffolk County Council Highways. At Friday Street, traffic management will be significantly reduced, however access to the construction of the two-village bypass for Stratford St Andrew and Farnham will continue. Grass seed will now be sown ahead of further planting in the autumn.

Along the B1122 corridor the required smaller road closures are being implemented. Pretty Road is now closed for the duration of the Sizewell Link Road construction. Further down the B1122, the Moat Road junction remains closed, however Abbey Lane has now reopened and Buckleswood Road is due to be fully opened without traffic management in mid-July.

Road safety improvement works along the A12 continue in Marlesford. A temporary speed limit

is in place to ensure the safety of all road users as the pedestrian crossing is installed, pavement and road junctions improvements and upgrades are all carried out. These works are due to be completed in the late summer.

Work at our Park and Ride sites continue, with further capacity being increased at the Wickham Market site with the access roads now complete. The roundabout at the park and ride in Darsham continues to progress, with the required traffic management now lifted at peak times. Willow Marsh Lane has now been reopened to traffic, pedestrians, and cyclists.

The rail link work continues at pace, with all the tracks laid for the temporary rail line around Leiston installed and trains beginning to run in and out of the temporary construction area. Over the coming months level crossing gates will be installed or upgraded along both the Saxmundham to Leiston, and Ipswich to Lowestoft branch lines, specifically at Melton and Darsham. This will require road closures and traffic management throughout installation.

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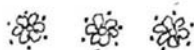


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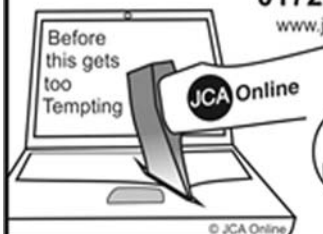
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
