Chairman's Report

I was delighted to receive an e.mail from Susan Stone of the British Wildlife Trust complimenting the Village on their management of the Common, she felt that the balance had been kept just right. Work undertaken by the Community Payback Workers has ensured that we are on target with all works required under the Management Plan. They will return in September to do more gorse clearance.

Both hedges on the Reckford Road have now been cut and regeneration has begun to take place. Similarly at last the Bakers/Lane Mill Street area is beginning to take shape. A new notice board graces the Bakers Lane side of the common which was provided with financial help from Barry Slater, our then District Councillor .

The Parish Council are in the process of getting quotes to improve the steps to Black Slough and hopefully this work will be undertaken soon. We are also looking at 'stabilising' the area in Bakers lane used for parking.

The common remains an emotive subject in the Village but the majority of people agreed to the present management plan and we aim to work to that for the coming years.

Thanks to all the people who help in many ways to maintain this wonderful asset the village owns – numbers in the work parties have increased but more volunteers are always very welcome. David, Penny and Juliet do an excellent job of informing people of work parties and walks etc. Do go for a walk on the common now the nicer weather is coming and enjoy the lovely flora and fauna maintained by all these dedicated people.

Hawthorn whips were planted in the gaps.
